“Superior Achievement” for eight years in a row in the state’s Schools FIRST Financial Rating System.

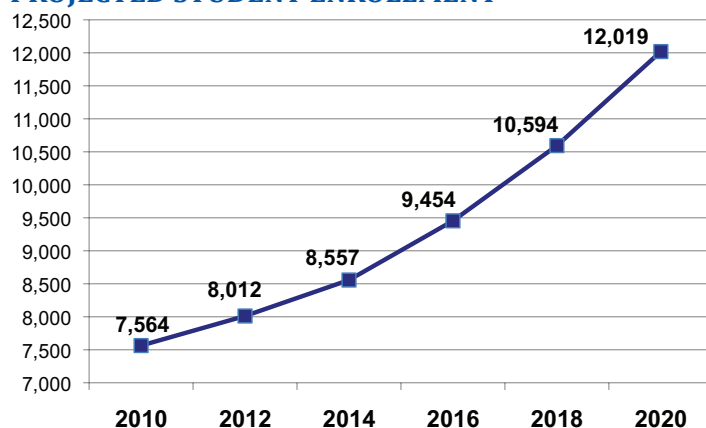
